Willis Organ Series: Tue 10 May @ 1.15pm – Michael Fulcher (Melbourne)

Since moving in Australia in 2004, **JENNIFER CHOU** has established herself as a recitalist at home and abroad, including solo recitals in the Town Halls of Adelaide, Melbourne, and Sydney, and in Cathedrals in Brisbane, Melbourne, Newcastle, and Sydney. As part of the 2008 Messiaen centennial celebration, she performed the complete *Livre du Saint Sacrement* for *Recitals Australia* in Adelaide. 2009 saw the world premiere of *The end of the illusion: an epitaph to Jean Baudrillard*, commissioned by the City of Melbourne, written by Australian composer David Chisholm (b.1970). Her 2010 performance of Bach's Clavierübung III at Elder Hall in Adelaide received critical acclaim.

Jennifer has given as solo recitalist at venues including Notre-Dame in Paris, Westminster Abbey, Magdeburg Cathedral, Hong Kong Cultural Centre, Wellington and Auckland Cathedrals (NZ); and at festivals in Denmark, Germany, Italy, Hong Kong and New Zealand.

A sought after teacher, Jennifer has worked at the Australian Catholic University, Melbourne High School and is also is a Suzuki Organ teacher.

Born in Hong Kong, Jennifer Chou graduated from The Chinese University of Hong Kong major in organ performance before completing her MMus with Wolfgang Rübsam at Northwestern University (USA). She furthered her studies at the Conservatoire National de Région de Rueil-Malmaison in Paris in the organ class of Susan Landale and obtained the *Prix de Virtuosité* and later specialised in French baroque and North German repertoire with Michel Bouvard and Jan Willem Jansen at the *Centre d'Etudes Supérieures de Musique et Danse* in Toulouse. She obtained the *Premier Prix d'Orgue at* the *Toulouse les Orgues International Festival* upon the completion of her studies. In 2003 she won Mention Speciale in the Biarritz International Organ Competition.

Jennifer is the Director of Music at Toorak Uniting Church in Melbourne, where she directs a small choir and 2 handbell groups, plays the organ and teaches children and young people to play the organ. She also appears in recitals as half of the Organ and Trombone Duo with Joseph Yu. The Duo has performed in Italy, England, New Zealand, Hong Kong, and in festivals in Australia

### 'Father' Willis Organ

Brisbane's 'Father' Henry Willis (1821-1901) organ was built in 1891-92 in London for the Brisbane Exhibition Building (now the 'Old Museum') in Bowen Park. Purchased by the *Brisbane City Council* in 1900, it was removed in 1927 for rebuilding, enlarging and installation in the new City Hall, which opened on 8 April 1930. A complete restoration was undertaken by Pierce Pipe Organs of Brisbane from 2010-14. This English Romantic style organ has 5 manuals, a pedal keyboard and 80 speaking stops.
