## ANDREJ KOUZNETSOV WITH THE UD CHAMBER SINGERS



**ANDREJ KOUZNETSOV ORGAN** 

Andrei Kouznetsov studied at the Sydney Conservatorium of Music with Phillip Swanton Whilst a student there he won several prizes and awards, including that of first place in the open section of the Sydney Organ Competition. During this time, he was Organ Scholar at the University of Sydney, and at St James'. King Street, where he was subsequently appointed Organist. Relocating to the United Kingdom in 2010, Andrej spent a vear as Organ Scholar at Salisbury Cathedral, where he was also Director of the Cathedral Chamber Choir. Following this, he was appointed Organ Scholar at Westminster Abbey in London, where he regularly accompanied and conducted the Abbey's world-renowned choir, and took part in high-profile events, such as the service to commemorate the fourhundredth anniversary of the King James Bible attended by Her Majesty the Queen and other members of the Royal Family. Whilst at the Abbey, Andrej studied organ with Thomas Trotter, and became an Associate of the Royal College of Organists. Andrei was appointed Organist of St John's Cathedral. Brisbane in 2013.
