Widely recognized for his passionate and authoritative interpretations of a broad repertoire, internationally acclaimed Australian organist CHRISTOPHER WRENCH is equally at home in the varied roles of soloist, liturgical musician, accompanist, continuo and chamber player.

International recognition followed performances at the Vienna Konzerthaus, St. Stephen's Cathedral, Austrian Radio, and competitions in Melbourne (1st Prize), Dublin (2nd Prize), St Alban's, England (Audience Prize) and Odense (1st Prize). He returned to Australia in 1991 to teach at the *Queensland Conservatorium of Music* and was Organist/Music Director at St Mary's Anglican Church, Kangaroo Point for 18 years prior to his and his appointment as *Director of Music* at Christ Church St Lucia (Brisbane) in 2013.

A regular performer at festivals throughout Australia; Christopher has appeared as soloist with the *Adelaide* and *Australian Chamber* Orchestras, *CSO*, *QSO*, the *Camerata of St John's* and the *Queensland Youth Symphony*, as is frequently heard on ABC Classic FM. Twenty international tours have included Austria, Canada, Czechoslovakia, Denmark, England, Germany, Hong Kong, Italy, Norway and Sweden. His SACD of Bach's *Six Organ Sonatas* for Melba Recordings received rave reviews from around the globe. In 2014 Wrench was one of 'five organists from five continents' who performed the Silbermann 300th Anniversary Gala concert in Freiberg Cathedral, Saxony. In 2017 Christopher was appointed co-tutor at the ACT Organ School in Canberra.
